Day 1 - Saturday

Split

Dinner

Embarkation in the Split harbor where the vessel will be docked. Check in from 14.00 h onwards. After settling, enjoy the guided tour of the city (not possible for late arrivals). Split is a historic town under UNESCO protection and part of the world heritage. One will find an abundance of Roman architecture – of special interest is the magnificent Diocletian palace, once inhabited by the Roman emperor. After the tour of Split, return to the ship for a greet dinner on board. Overnight in Split.



Day 2 - Sunday

Split, Bol (Brač Island), Vis

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Morning departure towards Brač. A swim stop at one of the most famous beaches in Dalmatia – Zlatni Rat near Bol (the Golden cape - known for its gravel promontory shifts from side to side as the wind and waves constantly change its shape). After lunch we are heading towards the island of Vis, once a strategic naval Yugoslav base and closed to the public for years. Due to this isolation, Vis has a special charm – “the Mediterranean as it once was” making it really interesting to visit. Vis town, situated on the northern side of the island, has developed near the remains of ancient Issa, the first urban center in Croatia. Overnight in Vis.



Day 3 - Monday

Vis, Biševo (Blue Cave), Korčula

Breakfast, Lunch

Early in the morning you cruise towards the small island of Biševo to visit the Blue Cave, a magnificent natural phenomenon (entrances to be paid on the spot – approx. 15 EUR). As sometimes weather conditions can be very unpredictable, the possibility of our visit will depend on those conditions, however you will be notified of this on time. Continue towards the island of Korčula best known as the birthplace of Marco Polo. Stop for lunch in one of the secluded bays en route. Afternoon arrival in Korčula Town followed by a guided walking tour of this enchanting place surrounded by walls and one of the best-preserved medieval cities in the Mediterranean. Fish bone street pattern was used in the design of Korčula Old Town for a natural cooling effect and it provides citizens with sheltered and comfortable accommodation. Korčula has an abundant choice of restaurants to enjoy a gourmet experience and numerous bars. Overnight in Korčula.



Day 4 - Tuesday

Korčula, Mljet, Dubrovnik

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

This morning, you cruise a little further north to the Island of Mljet. The legend says Greek hero Odysseus spent years on this island when he was captured by the nymph Calypso. Join the cruise manager for a stroll to the famous salt lakes in the Mljet National Park (entrance fee approx. 18-20 Eur) and enjoy the boat ride to St Mary Isle to visit an ancient Benedictine monastery, an old abbey and a Church dating back to the 12th Century. Lunch on board and departure towards Dubrovnik. Late afternoon arrival in Dubrovnik, but before we tie the ropes at Gruž harbour the captain will take you for an evening cruise alongside the old city walls while a buffet dinner is served on deck. Enjoy the spectacular views of this magnificent old town. Overnight in Dubrovnik.



Day 5 - Wednesday

Dubrovnik

Breakfast, Wine tasting

The whole day is dedicated to Dubrovnik. After breakfast transfer to the old town for the guided walking tour. Afternoon at leisure to find idyllic spots for lunch and dinner. For those of you with more enthusiasm, we recommend to walk the famous walls 1,940 m long and take a stroll along the walking street "STRADUN" – both a street and a square, a promenade inside the city walls. Overnight in Dubrovnik.



Day 6 - Thursday

Dubrovnik, Trstenik

Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Early morning departure towards the Pelješac peninsula, afternoon transfer to the village followed by a visit to a local farm where you will indulge in a typical village party with Croatian delicacies, an all-inclusive dinner with local dishes made from their own produce (the price for the excursion is 300 kn per person or approx. 40 Eur). Late transfer back to the ship. Overnight on Pelješac peninsula.



Day 7 - Friday

Trstenik, Hvar

Breakfast, Lunch

Continue towards the jet-set island of Hvar with a swimming stop and lunch on board at the Pakleni Islands. Hvar, the longest and sunniest island in the Adriatic is known for glorious lavender fields and breath-taking beauty. Arrival in the afternoon on the tour of the town - the Renaissance cathedral with its original tower, and the oldest community theatre in Europe founded in 1612. Hike up the zig-zag path to the town fort overlooking the harbour for lovely scenic views of your ship and the Paklinski Islands. Overnight on the island on Hvar.
